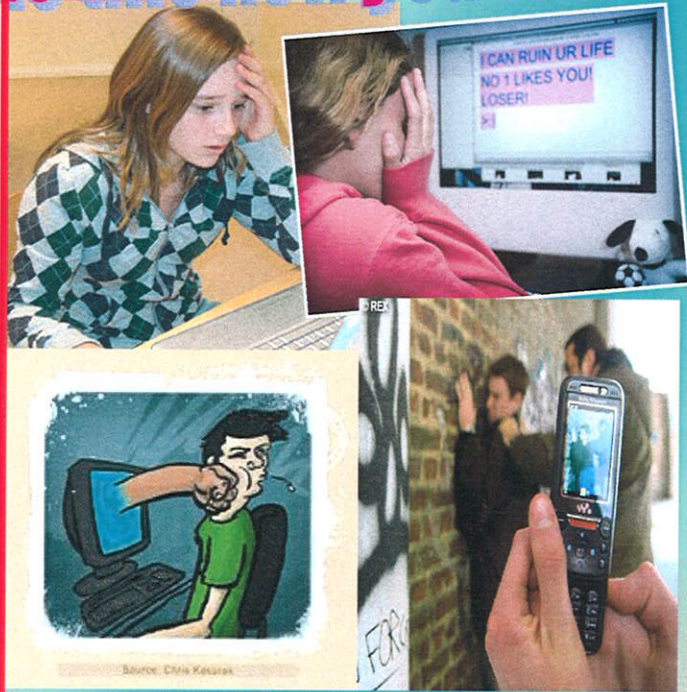


Is this how you feel?

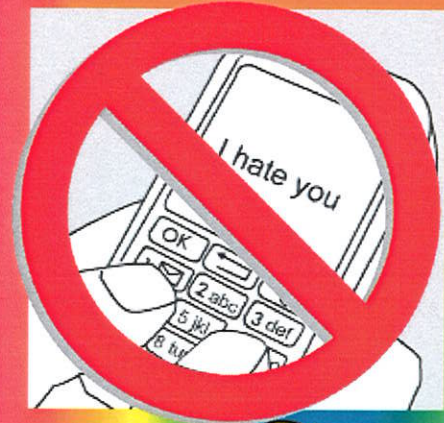

Be Smart Be Cool!

I like being smart online. If any thing goes wrong online or upsets you make sure you tell an adult about it...

It's a great idea to join hands! Keep personal info like your name and address safe online.

Being SMART Rules!

Safe: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information, such as your name, email, phone number, home address or school name to people who you do not trust online.

Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents or carers permission and even then only when they can be present.

Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or text from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems they may contain viruses or nasty messages!

Reliable Someone online may be lying about who they are, and information you find on the internet may not be reliable.

Tell your parents or carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried. You can report online abuse to the police at www.thinkuknow.co.uk

HOW SMART ARE YOU?

Zip it, Block it, Flag it: code for online safety

Zip It - Protect yourself. Don't share personal details with strangers online.

Block It - Stop unwanted emails coming to children and stop them accessing certain Internet sites.

Flag It - Flag up any suspicious people or websites to the relevant person, whether parent, teacher or the police.
