Year 3 Islington Library Membership

Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRFs)

A letter has gone home about these already with more detail, but just to remind you what the maths KIRFs are for this half term:

Year 1— To recall number bonds to 10

Year 2— To recall the multiplication and division facts for the 10 times table in any order.

Year 3— To recall the multiplication and division facts for the 4 times table in any order.

Year 4— To know decimal equivalents of fractions.

Year 5— To recall square numbers up to 12^2 and their square roots.

Year 6— To identify prime numbers up to 50.

These are essential pieces of maths knowledge for your child to memorise, so please support them by practicing at home regularly. Thank you.

Parent workshop—NSPCC Stay Safe Online

We are keen for as many to attend the NSPCC Stay Safe Online free workshop next Friday morning as possible. Please do consider giving up an hour of your time to learn more about . We have completed surveys with the children in the school, which have given us greater insight into the use of the internet amongst our students, for example:

- Most of the KS1 children feel safe when they use the internet
- Most of the KS1 children know who to speak to if someone is unkind to them on the internet.
- The most popular internet activities are playing games and watching TV programmes.
- Gaming is significantly more popular amongst boys in Years 5 & 6, than amongst girls.
- A large number of boys in Years 5 & 6 said they spend more than 4hrs per day on the internet.
- The majority of children in KS2 have a favourite blogger or vlogger that they regularly watch.
- Most children in KS2 regularly use social media sites, the most popular being WhatsApp, Instagram and Snapchat
- Nearly all children said they had received lessons on how to stay safe on the internet.
